Annually, more than 25,000 people in our community get clothing, food, emergency shelter and utility assistance from The Salvation Army. Character building, counseling, fellowship opportunities and personal encouragement are provided on a weekly basis without discrimination. If necessary, referrals are made to our alcohol and drug rehab center. All services are provided free of charge

Mental health care is offered and emotional, marital, drug and stress-related problems are dealt with at the Center. Through an agreement with Jefferson Regional Medical Center, inpatient services are accessible. The center offers an array of services, including individual, family, marital, and group therapy, along with substance abuse treatment.

**SOUTHEAST ARKANSAS RSVP | 870-659-3809**

Jefferson County and Arkansas County have over 500 adult volunteers that are provided opportunities to share their experiences, abilities, and skills through community service. The purpose of this program is to meet critical community needs and provide a high quality experience that will enrich the lives of RSVP volunteers.

**VOICES FOR CHILDREN/COURT APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATES | 870-536-5922**

Voices For Children trains volunteers to advocate in the court system for abused and neglected children in Jefferson and Lincoln Counties. Volunteers advocate for the children assigned to them and provide reports to the juvenile judge in order for him to make informed decisions that positively impact each child's livelihood.
